Patterson and County Councillor Butroid**Village Caretaker's report:** The Village Caretaker reported that he has repaired the shelter in the play area, renovated the bin near Churchfield, cleared litter from the playing field and cleaned play equipment.**Notes of the Meeting of Ingham Parish Council held on the 8th June 2020 to be approved as the Minutes:**Councillors RESOLVED unanimously to approve the Minutes of the meeting on 8th June 2020.**Police Report:** There have been 2 incidents reported, firstly on 2/7/20 there was a theft from a vehicle on Saxon Way and on 5/7/20 there was damage caused to a front gate at a property on The Green.**Clerk's report on matters outstanding:** The Clerk reported that the post box stump on Lincoln Road has not yet been removed. Lincoln Road development—the transfer of open space continues. A tree survey of trees on The Green and pond site is postponed until it is safe for the inspector to visit. Play area lease—an update from Chattertons is awaited. Flooding on Long Lane has been reported to LCC and Northern Power have been contacted. The height and health of the hedge bordering the footpath adjacent to Grange Close has been reported to LCC. Work to transition to a new Parish Council website has been started. A damaged road sign at the junction of Church Hill and Middle Street has been reported to LCC. The speed and footpath issue on Church Hill around the Church has been reported to LCC. Long Lane classification – Councillor Harris is pursuing this.

Faster Broadband – Councillor Harris is looking at options. Sign Down on The Green – reported to LCC Highways. Low Farm Footpath sign damaged – reported to Countryside Access. Grange Lane Parking and Planning – Highways and Planning Enforcement have been asked to review the changes made.

P3 Liaison Officers report: Councillor Buck said footpaths are overgrown in places but walkable including 24/1, 17/2 and 21/2. The Clerk will request a footpath cut. The Clerk will order Pink Spray for highlighting dog fouling.**Items raised by Councillors for future agenda items:** Councillor Graham requested that street lighting be discussed. Councillor Buck asked whether there was a neighbourhood watch scheme in the village. The Clerk will ask the PCSO and a resident whether this is currently active.**Defibrillator Pads:** Councillors RESOLVED unanimously to ratify the decision to purchase replacement pads for both defibrillators. 141217, Cliff Farm The Cliff Ingham Lincoln LN1 2YQ, erect a general agricultural machinery storage building – no comments were made.

Risk Assessment: The Clerk presented the report showing that the play equipment is operational safe to use. Councillors RESOLVED unanimously to ratify the decision to re-open the play park with the mitigating measures in place highlighted in the risk assessment. Councillor Brown will raise the issue of an oil deposit and suspicious vehicle in the car park with the school headteacher.

Neighbourhood Plan: Councillor Nicholson updated Councillors with progress made. A draft site assessment report has been sent by AECOM. This will be circulated to Councillors. There will be a public event in due course to record residents' comments.

COVID-19: Councillors agreed to maintain current measures. Councillor Nicholson thanked everyone who has assisted in the community. The governing body for Parish Councils continues to recommend virtual meetings.

Village Hall funding: The Village Hall activity was discussed.

Consideration of the request to use the car park: Councillors agreed not to allow use of the car park until a review has been completed of current usage by vendors.

Review of Curry Jacks: The Clerk will ask Curry Jacks and Fleurs Kitchen what their experience and plans are.

Protection of the verge on the High Street: Councillors did not agree to the installation of stakes on the verge. The Clerk will try to arrange a meeting with Highways to discuss other options.

Track Closure Short Lane: Councillor Brown provided an update on discussions with Mr. Rose. Mr. Rose does not want to allow use of the track to Fillingham to the public due to concerns over damage to the verges and wildlife areas planted adjacent to it. There is also concern over pedestrian safety due to large farm vehicles using this part of the track. Mr. Rose has noted a marked increase in footpath usage during lockdown but many are straying from the paths and damaging the adjacent wildlife/ planting. The track therefore remains closed for the time being. The Parish Council will try to include this issue within the Neighbourhood Plan.

Tree Overhanging Footpath and Tree Inspections: The Clerk will request that the tree adjacent to the footpath on West End/ High Street is cut back. The Clerk will ask the Parish Council insurer about any rules on the frequency of tree inspections in the village.

Parish Council website: The Clerk reported that he had begun the population of the new site and this is required to meet new accessibility regulation. Councillors agreed that he should record time spent so that a payment for time can be made.

Correspondence Received: All correspondence was discussed as part of agenda items.

Date of the next Parish Council meeting: The next Ingham Parish Council meeting will be on held on 14th September 2020. Meeting Ended 20.41

FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN

This is a dish that we saw Tom Kerridge making on the telly; it looked apapetising so decided to give it a go. It's called ONE LAYER LASAGNE but there's no pasta in sight!

Ingredients:

- 800g 5% fat beef mince (we opted for 500g)
- 1 tbsp light olive oil
- 2 large onions (finely chopped)
- 4 grated garlic cloves (or even out of a jar)
- 2 carrots (finely chopped)
- 2 celery sticks (finely chopped)
- 1 tbsp caraway seeds
- 3 tbsp tomato purée
- 700ml beef stock
- 400g tin chopped tomatoes
- 1 beef stock cube
- 1 tbsp dried oregano
- 2 sprigs rosemary leaves
- 200g button mushrooms halved
- 2 large courgettes sliced at an angle
- 2 beef tomatoes sliced
- 250g ricotta
- 125g grated mozzarella
- 10g grated parmesan
- Sea salt & ground pepper

One Layer Lasagne



Method:

- Preheat the oven to 200°C/180°C fan/Gas 6
- Spread the mince out onto a baking tray lined with baking paper. Bake on the top shelf for 40 minutes, breaking it up every 10 mins. It should be a deep brown and even colour. Remove and set aside. Turn the oven off for now.
- Heat the oil in a large non-stick frying pan or wok over a medium heat. Cook the onions for 10 minutes, or until soft, adding a splash of water if they start to stick.
- Add the garlic and cook for 1 minute. Stir in the carrots and celery and cook for 5 minutes then add the caraway seeds, stirring for 30 seconds. We found these provided the dominant and pleasant taste to this dish. Stir through the tomato purée and cook for 1 minute.
- Add the mince, stock, tinned tomatoes, stock cube, herbs and mushrooms. We only made 500ml and found this might even have been a bit too much to generate a thick and creamy ragu. Bring to the boil, then lower the heat to a simmer and then cook for 25-30 minutes or until the sauce has thickened to a rich consistency.
- Pour the ragu into a suitable ovenproof dish. Layer the courgettes then the tomatoes on top, seasoning each layer with salt and pepper. Season the ricotta with salt and pepper and dot evenly over the tomatoes.
- Scatter over the mozzarella and parmesan and bake for 35 mins (same oven temperature as before), or until the topping is golden brown. Our effort took more like an hour or so for the carrots and courgettes to cook through. Next time we will slice the latter particularly thinly.



Verdict

We found this offering, which made about six helpings, quite pleasant although the ricotta was not really to our liking. Next time we will leave it out.

The Saxon Venture!

A year ago this group of detectorists discovered brooches, girdle hangers and spearheads that are usually linked with early Saxon burials in a farmers field in Cammeringham. They notified the Historic Places Team and after gaining permission from the landowner an archaeological dig began on the 1st September with a team of 6 from Network Archaeology.



From the start the dig was followed by thousands of people from the UK, North America, Europe and Australia on their FB page. Daily updates photos and videos turned many of us into amateur archaeologists and schoolchildren watched with interest.

The first trenches were dug and on the first day they found remains of a human jaw along with an iron object and a Saxon pot. Day 3 revealed they had found a double Saxon burial, this was a very exciting find.



At the time of discovery it was believed the skeletons were of a male and a female but this will need to be confirmed

Perhaps one of the surprising things about the dig was how shallow the trenches were and yet the burials seemed relatively undamaged.

Throughout the first 5 days of the dig the detectorists assisted the team, continually looking for other items that may have been disturbed by ploughing.

By day four at least 4 burial sites had been uncovered containing skeletons and cremation pots. The pottery and metal artefacts indicated that the burials were from the 5th-6th Century, further tests will confirm the date.

Within the double burial a spear, shield boss, a complete pot and fragments of glass were found, once removed the skeletons were lifted and sent for tests.

The burials were found in a mixture of crouched and supine positions which indicated people of different beliefs or traditions were buried together.

The picture to the right is of a small-long brooch discovered early in the dig.

The dig resulted in the discovery of 12 Burials and 7 cremations . They will be studied so they can confirm sex, date and discover the cause of death, they may even learn about their diet, diseases or even where the person originated from. This is called Osteoarchaeology- the study of human remains .It may also be possible to use Virtual reality for facial reconstruction .



When all the tests are done the plan is to

respectfully return the skeletons to the same burial site and to bury them deep enough so that further damage will not occur from modern farming methods.



The items of jewellery, pots, spearheads , textiles and other items found in the graves will be taken to Lincoln University for further investigation.

As the burials were all very different it is hoped that each will provide a different insight into the Anglo - Saxon world.

There is a plan to show the finds of the dig in a local village hall so we may get to see them and eventually move to The Collection in Lincoln.

By the final day over 50.000 had been following the dig in our local village of Cammeringham, most of them virtual .

This is only a very brief description of the events from 1st- 11th Sept, you can find more on the Lincs CC webpage and visit The Collection when the discoveries will be put on display .

District Councillor's report – The new planning policy, particularly Rule 77 were causing the District problems. The County Council leader had proposed, without consultation, a Unitary Authority with the abolition of District Councils in Lincolnshire.

And you also will have heard of the excellent restoration work completed by 'The Friends of St Cuthbert's Church Brattleby' over the years. With the forthcoming work of re-plastering and decorating, Brattleby church will look all but new!

Our good old Lincolnshire has escaped the worst of the virus, let us thank God, and we are trying to get back to normal things of life again. But we shall cherish how everybody came together to care for each other during the 6 months of lockdown and we are not out of the woods yet! The virus might have spread fear and death all over the world but it has also brought forth the innate goodness within each of us.

One more thing before I finish, I wish to inform you also that we have re-started *a mid-week service at Ingham every Wednesday at 11.00 am*. At this service you will also have an opportunity for special prayer for healing and once we are able to do so, also anointing with holy oil. This service is in addition to the Scampton weekly Communion held at 10.00 am regularly. Just keep in mind that these weekday services are not just for the village where it is held but for the whole Parish. Whether you live in Fillingham, Burton Waters or Thorpe Le Fallows or elsewhere, you can just come and join the service. Remember, we all belong to One Parish and that is *The Springline Parish, 9 Churches, One Parish, Following Jesus!*
